UPDATE: Alternatives to High Cost Hemorrhoid/Proctitis Treatments

You may have noticed recently that Hydrocortisone containing rectal products (suppositories, foams, and creams) have *increased dramatically in price, are NOT being covered by insurance, or are on national backorder*. To help address these issues, Moss Compounding Pharmacy is able to prepare alternative compounded options that may provide a more feasible and accessible option for patients.
